Working as part of the Corporate Communications team, the Welsh Translator will be responsible for providing a written Welsh/English translation service for staff and fire and rescue service publications and communications to meet the statutory requirements set out in the Welsh language standards. They will also provide translation of documents and reports, as well as a simultaneous translation service at meetings and other events, according to Service requirements.

We are looking for a fluent Welsh speaker, educated to degree level in a Welsh Language related subject and a recognised qualification in translation or demonstrable experience in translation skills.
