Raise awareness of:

1. Road Safety

- Create posters / leaflets to raise awareness of the appropriate speed to drive in your local community.
- Create a campaign to encourage children to wear cycle helmets and high viz gear.
- Promote seatbelt safety with your friends and family
- Create a campaign to remind drivers not to use their mobile phones whilst driving.

2. Anti-Social Behaviour

- Launch a project to highlight Anti-Social Behaviour in your area
- Think about environmental issues in your area litter, dog fouling etc and find ways to improve the issue.

3. Crime Prevention

- Design a project which helps vulnerable people in your area reduce their risk of becoming victims of crime.
- Think of a project which raises awareness of online scams

- · Take a mobile phone in a waterproof pouch
- Wear the right leash.
- Avoid offshore winds and check tide times
- 2. The RNLI's four core water safety messages for young people. Create poster or a video for use on social media based on the four key water safety messages:
- Stop and Think
- Stay Together
- Float
- Call 999 or 112
- 3. World Drowning Prevention Day on July 25th. World Drowning Prevention Day calls on people to 'do one thing to prevent drowning' on or near July 25th. What can you think of which would achieve this?
