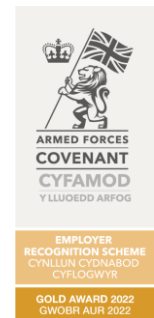
The Senior Performance Analyst Support the delivery of the Service's corporate planning framework with the provision of performance monitoring, including benchmarking exercises against other Fire and Rescue Services. Support the delivery of effective systems to measure and improve performance against service objectives and support operational delivery. You will Provide research and analytical advice and support across the Service to meet internal and external requirements. Provide quality assurance of data and performance information to ensure accuracy and integrity of data. The successful candidate will present complex information and provide performance reports to support the strategic management of the Service, including North Wales Fire and Rescue Authority and the Service Management Team. You will contribute to the ongoing development of systems relating to performance information and assist with ensuring compatibility of information between systems used to improve service delivery.



The successful candidate will need experience in electronic software including Microsoft Excel and GIS software to extract and present data. Design and compile map extracts and reports based on digital map products. They will be an effective communicator with good organisational skills to work independently and manage their own workload to ensure they meet departmental and organisational deadlines. They will need excellent attention to detail and accuracy skills with the ability to transform data into usable and relevant information.



The role will be located at Rhyl Community Fire Station; however, agile working is available from a combination of home and alternative Service locations and this will be discussed further with the successful candidate.



Please note that Welsh Language level 2 skills are a requirement for this post; if not demonstrated on appointment, support will be provided to achieve this during the probation period. The successful candidate will be subject to a standard DBS check and references prior to appointment.
